HOW TO PLAN, LEAD, AND PARTICIPATE IN A CRUISE

BY Tom Mitchell

Planning the Cruise

- Select your destination. Pick a nice restaurant, pub, winery, museum, other venue or event that will make a great destination for the cruise. Make sure that there is sufficient parking at the start point, any "pit stops", and at the destination.
- Plan a starting point where, restrooms, gas and food are nearby. You want gas tanks full and bladders empty when you depart!
- Lay out your route beforehand; do one or two dry runs - if possible, in the same traffic conditions you'll encounter the day of the event. A dry run a day or two before the event is important as construction, road closures, or other unknown changes can really cause problems on the cruise....communicating the problem, backing up or turning around the cars, and figuring out how to get back on course are challenging at best.
- Schedule adequate bathroom breaks - every 1 to 2 hours.
- Prepare written directions and/or strip maps and provide copies to each car.
- Be sure to allow extra time over the dry run time; a caravan will always take more time.
- Allow for a gathering place to regroup the cars after going through areas where the group has a high probability of getting broken up.
- Make arrangements, as necessary, at your destination. Let restaurants know how many to expect and when. Check prices of meals and any admissions cost, etc., so participants know how much money they will need to bring along.
- Get the necessary information (meeting time and location, short overview of the cruise, any out-of-pocket costs, destination, etc.) out to the CVCC Website and Google Group, as necessary. Get the date of the Cruise in the newsletter Happenings Calendar as soon as it has been determined.
- If this is your first time as leader, feel free to call one of the experienced members. You won't have much trouble finding someone who'd love to help you out.

Leading the Cruise

- **Communication!** It is essential for the Leader and the "Trail" (last Vette) to be able to communicate by radio. Ideally, everyone should have a radio, as there will be breaks in the line of cars due to traffic lights, road crossings, and "Interlopers" (a non-Vette) among other things. If everyone does not have a radio, try to get those who do spaced throughout the line.
- A radio call indicating a break in the caravan enables the Leader to slow down or pull over and wait for the caravan to catch up.
- If there are more than 15 cars, consider splitting the group in two. If you anticipate such a large group, arrange in advance for a leader for the 2d group. Too long a caravan gets unwieldy and often causes a "double break" in cars. Separate the departure of two groups by at least 10 minutes. It's amazing how often the 2d group will catch up to the lead group and you're back to having one large difficult to control line of cars.
- Watch your speed, especially while the caravan is going through areas where there are lights and stop signs. There is an amazing dynamic in Cruising. The end car will always be going significantly faster than the lead car. If you are going the speed limit, the rear cars are exceeding it! They will be downright speeding if there is a break in the line. You will have to go well under the speed limit (gasp!) to keep everything safe, particularly while cars are catching up. As the Leader, the bottom line is to travel at just below or at the speed limit. If you can't see the last car, slow down until everyone has caught back up.
- Keep the group together. Slow down - or pull over - until everyone is back in line. If you are approaching a traffic light that has been green for a while and will turn red before the caravan can get through it, stop. You will now be the first car when it turns green, you significantly improve the chances that all cars will get through it.
- If you're in a highly trafficked area, accept that the caravan will be broken up and regroup at an appropriate location where you can pull back out without creating a traffic hazard.
- On the day of the Cruise, gather the participants at the start point and review the route (pass out maps/route instructions), cover any tricky areas, review the rules (communication, regrouping, safety, etc.)

Participating in the Cruise

- **RSVP.** The Leader needs to know how many cars will participate to ensure adequate parking at the start, "pit stops", and destination, to determine if more than one caravan group is necessary, and to call ahead for reservations if required.
- **Observe all traffic rules and regulations!** Be courteous to other drivers. Don't expect that everyone will let the entire caravan go at once. If they don't that's okay, they don't have to. Don't block public access or block traffic trying to get the line together.
- Bring a radio. It adds fun to the trip and really helps keep everything going smoothly. If you don't have a radio and plan to "Cruise" on a regular basis, get one! CVCC uses 22 channel FRS/GMRS 2-way radios. They can be purchased at Home Depot, Radio Shack, Walmart, BassPro Shop, Amazon, etc.
- If you don't have a radio and there is a break in the line or you have a problem, flash your headlights. The car in front will pick up the signal and flash their headlights until someone with a radio gets the message and calls the leader to inform him of the situation.
- Check your rear-view mirror regularly to see if the car behind you is flashing his lights.
- When all cars have caught up after pulling off the road to regroup, the "Trail" should pull out onto the road first when it's all clear and block approaching traffic to enable the caravan to get back on the road. All the other cars should immediately and simultaneously pull onto the roadway once the "Trail" has blocked cars approaching the rear of the caravan.
- Stay together. Don't let large gaps open between you and the car in front. This lets a dreaded "Interloper" infiltrate the line which wrecks the aesthetic effect and could cause those behind the "Interloper" to miss a turn.
- Start the day with a full tank of gas and an empty bladder!
- Finally, enjoy the ride, the fellowship and plan to step up and lead a future Cruise!





